December 24th: The Grinch Within: self centeredness

- I. We struggle with Self centeredness because it is the default position of humanity: One of the first words that a child learns is the word, "mine". Ever since Adam and Eve rebelled against God, humans have naturally made themselves the center of worship. This can even be disguised at times. There are many who appear to be selflessly serving, when their motivation is to receive the attention and praise of others.
- II. Herod's self centered self worth dictated that he defend his kingship at all cost: In Matthew 2:1-18, we have the story of Herod and the wisemen. Historically, Herod is known as a brilliant architect and his cruelty. When Herod learns that the Messiah is coming, he is disturbed. The reason is that his self worth is based on his kingship. To have a lord over him would make him a nobody. So he resorts to deception and then violence to protect his power.
- III. The Magi found their self worth as worshippers loved by the one true king: When the magi learn of the coming king, they journey to worship him. They find their value as recipients of God's love and end up sharing the joy of the new born king.
- IV. Self centeredness is defeated when we allow Jesus to sit on the throne of our lives: The magi show an alternative by allowing God to rule their lives. If Christmas is all about God's good rule coming into this world, then it could be said that self centeredness is defeated by having more of "Christmas" in our lives. This is echoed later by John the Baptist who stated about Jesus, "*He must become greater, I must become less.*"

Conclusion
